# What Must I Do To Be Saved?

THE IMPORTANCE OF THE

*Then he brought them out and said, "Sirs, what must I do to be saved?" And they said, "Believe in the Lord Jesus, and you will be saved, you and your household." And they spoke the word of the Lord to him and to all who were in his house.*

**ACTS 16:30-32**

In regards to social work, many would ask this pertinent question, "if you really want to help, why share the Gospel? Why not just give help and love them?" This is an important question that deserves a well-defined answer. To answer, we look to sacred Scripture to examine the importance of the gospel in social work, or any kind of work we are being called to do.

In Acts 16, we see the Apostle Paul and Silas arriving to Philippi, following the leading of the Lord that led them to Macedonia to preach the Gospel. Being a Roman colony and a trade city with various ethnicities, they sought for opportunities to share the Word. However, having cast out a spirit from a slave girl with divination gifts, Paul and Silas were beaten up by a mob and jailed by the magistrates. They were entrusted to a jailer, who put them in the inner prison and chained. Here, we will take a look at the unforgettable experience of this jailer, who discovered three important truths as to why the gospel is important.

### Our Inevitable Destination

The jailer was fast asleep when an earthquake shook the prison doors open and unfastened the prisoners' chains. Waking up to the commotion, he drew his sword, ready to kill himself, as he knew he will in turn be killed should the prisoners have escaped. At that moment, he faced what we will all face one day: the inevitability of death. Some of us experience poverty, some experience riches. Some of us experience success, some experience failure. Yet for sure, all of us, without exemption will face death one day, and like the jailer's experience, it may come suddenly. Another inevitable destination we all face is the fact of judgment. When the jailer heard Paul's voice telling him that no prisoner had escaped, he ran towards Paul and Silas, with fear and trembling, and asked a question that presumes judgment. "Sirs, what

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must I do to be saved?" was his question, a question that reveals the jailer understood the judgment he was going to face at death, and his inability to save himself from the coming judgment. It is a question that many of us who realize our inevitable destination, has asked or will ask. Why do we ask such questions? It is because we know, that there is something in us that will hinder us from having a good favour in judgment, and that is sin.

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The problem with the world, though numerous, are traced to one source: sin. Sin, as defined by the Word of God, is rebellion against the one true living God. Sin is the reason why we have an inevitable destination, and none of us are capable of removing its efficacy.

## Our Inconceivable Deliverance

Should the jailer had a way of salvation? After all, he just became part of the unjust imprisonment and torturing of men of God. Despite who he was and what he had done, God made a way for him, and us, to be saved. Paul answered the jailer's question adamantly and without hesitation or confusion. "Believe in the Lord Jesus and you will be saved, you and your household." There was a deliverance provided, by the person and work of Jesus Christ. Here is the problem: he was from Philippi, and he never heard about this Jesus. So Paul introduced Jesus to the jailer and his family through the only reliable source of truth regarding the person and work of Jesus: the Word of God. Salvation is only possible when we believe in the Jesus of the Scriptures. Often when we hear the name Jesus, we quickly assume that we are talking about the same Jesus. However, in this world, there are different versions of Jesus in people's minds, versions which contradict the Jesus of Scripture. Thus, it is vital that in extending love and help to people, we do so by extending the knowledge about the Jesus of Scripture. For only through this Jesus, can one be truly saved from his sin, from death, and from judgment. Only the Gospel can change our destination from damnation to deliverance. Only the Gospel can produce a change of direction in our lives.

## Our Indescribable Direction

Finally, we see what happens to the jailer and his family when they heard the Gospel of Jesus Christ. First, we see them being baptized. In baptism, we see a change in their personhood. Baptism is more than a ritual or ordinance: it is a visible expression of repentance, of turning away from what was wrong into what is right. In being baptized, they have declared what Jesus had done to them, in that they were changed from the inside out. Second, we see them washing Paul and Silas' wounds, and sharing a meal with them. In this we see a change in their relationships. Previously, Paul and Silas were regarded as prisoners and enemies, now they are brothers who love them. Third, we see them being greatly joyful, for they had believed God. In this we see their change in their yearning. There was great joy in believing in God. Oh, how many have missed having such great joy for refusing to see who God truly is.

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All of us recognize the need for change in our lives. For some, it is a change of doing what is wrong to doing what is right. For some, it is having people around you who love you and seek your good. For some, it is possessing an indescribable joy and peace that no other event, person, or material being can grant to the heart and mind.

## Conclusion

With these three reasons, our inevitable destination, our inconceivable deliverance, and our indescribable direction – we recognize that the Gospel possesses an answer for these three truths in our life. Hence, we pray and toil for the children, the families, and the communities we encounter. We pray that they may hear the Gospel. We toil that they may experience the life-changing effects of the Gospel experienced and lived out. Our prayer and work go on in hopes that they will experience great joy and life change when they see who God really is, and what He desires for each and every one of us all.

*Rhodora has been sponsored since 2004 when she was kindergarten. Now, having just graduated from college with a degree in Bachelor of Elementary Education, she looks back fondly at how it became possible: the faithful support of her sponsor.*

Hello, would you be so kind as to introduce yourself?

*Hi, I am Rhodora, and I am twenty years old. I took up Bachelor of Elementary Education. I graduated last May 2019.*

You were sponsored at an early age. What was the impact of the program?

*When I was a child, from 6 to 12 years old, I was involved in church activities such as Kids' Choir. I was also baptized at the age of 12. As I became a teenage, I also began participating in youth groups in my church. As a youth, I was encouraged to become a Sunday School Teacher, teaching kids in our church about the Bible. I also became part of the youth choir, and after a few years, I was challenged and trained to become part of the Worship team.*

How has the Child Sponsorship Program been beneficial to you?

*I realized God has a purpose for me in being in this program. This program has helped me to develop my relationship with God, on how to grow in my faith in God. Through the program, I remember being able to participate in school activities, field trips, and camps because of the support I received from the sponsorship program. During my college days, I was able to purchase textbooks because of the support from my sponsor.*

You are one of the children who have graduated from the program from kinder to college. What would you like to say to your sponsor who has been helping you throughout all these years?

*To my sponsor, thank you for helping me throughout all these years. Thank you for supporting me in my studies even though you haven't seen me personally. I am so blessed and glad to have you. I pray that everything you do for others will return to you in the form of blessings. My prayer also is that God will guide you in everything you do.*



## Senior Citizens

### What We Do

#### Gospel-Centered Lessons

Our partner churches conduct regular lessons for the seniors that tackle the issue of dignity, right living, and the question of life now and beyond. More importantly, Christ is presented as He is revealed in Scripture and the seniors are allowed to make informed choices regarding what they had learned.

#### Gift-giving

During special occasions like Christmas, or when our partners would sponsor an event, we give gift packs to our senior citizens. Gift packs are filled with items like sugar, milk, coffee, and other consumables. Our aim is to bring joy to their hearts through these simple but meaningful gifts.

#### Medical Missions

We aim to conduct free medical checkups for our senior citizens and provide some initial medication for common and easily treatable sicknesses. Through the medical missions, we hope to help alleviate any suffering our seniors experience due to their sickness, and also have an opportunity to seek how we can serve them better.

### Short-Term Projects

These are small-scale projects which aim to address a particular community problem. Some communities lack clean water while others have an unemployment problem. Our team works with the partner church and local community leaders in identifying the problems and producing viable and sustainable solutions for said problems.

### Volunteer Works

These are visits by friends and volunteers who come to the ministry sites for a short period of time. They come to visit, interact, and impart important life skills and knowledge to the children, families, and the community.

As such, we work with both the local leaders and the partner church in helping establish a structure where the people may gather for worship and for the listening of God's Word.
