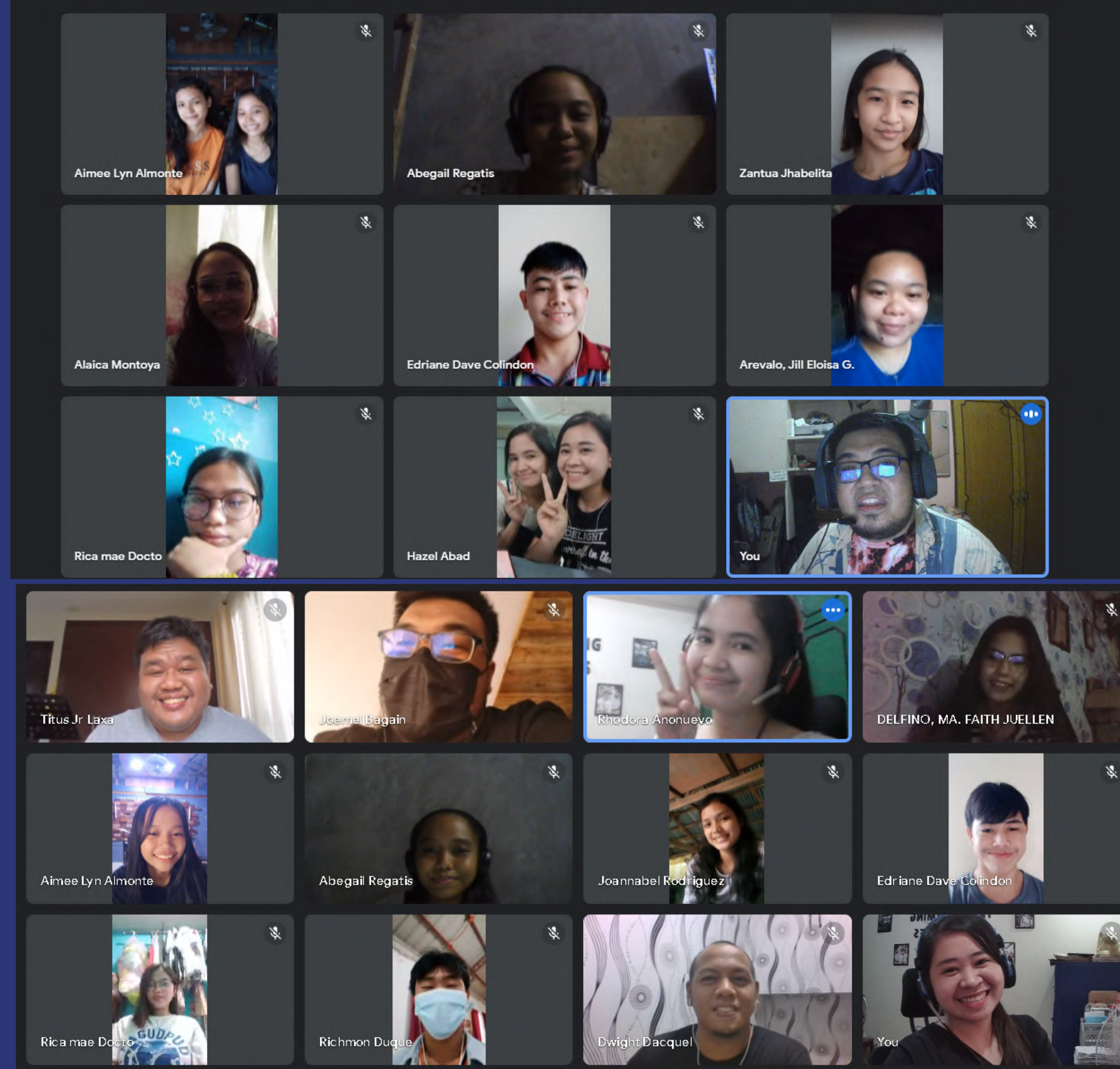


Highlights

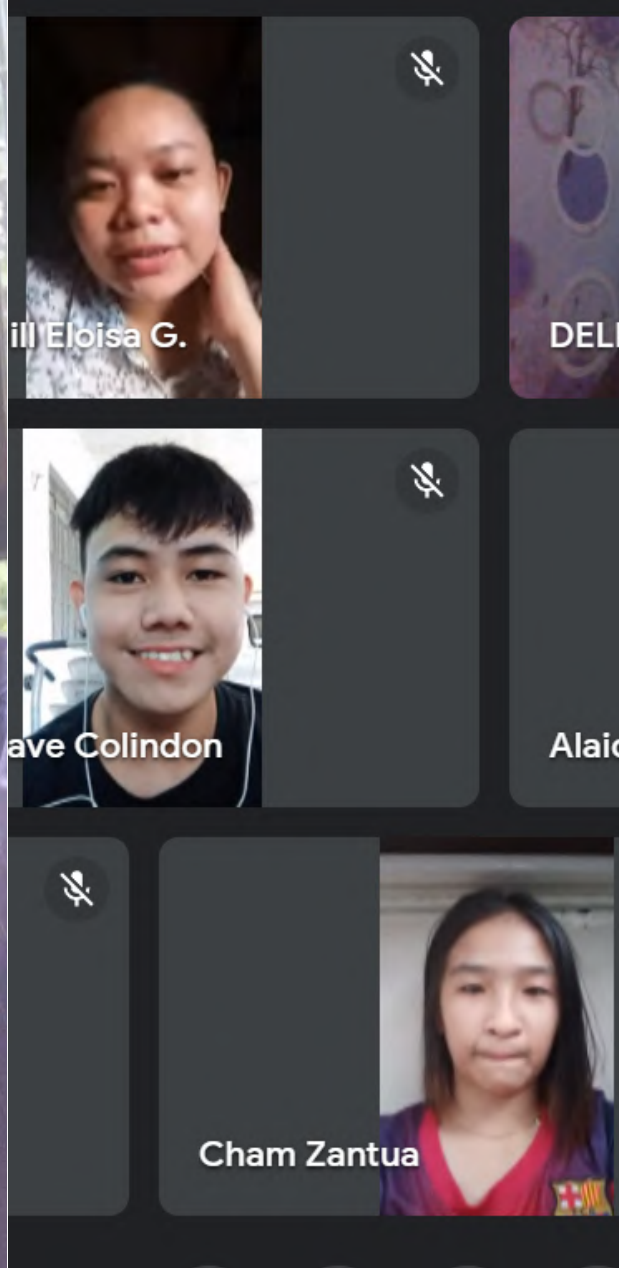
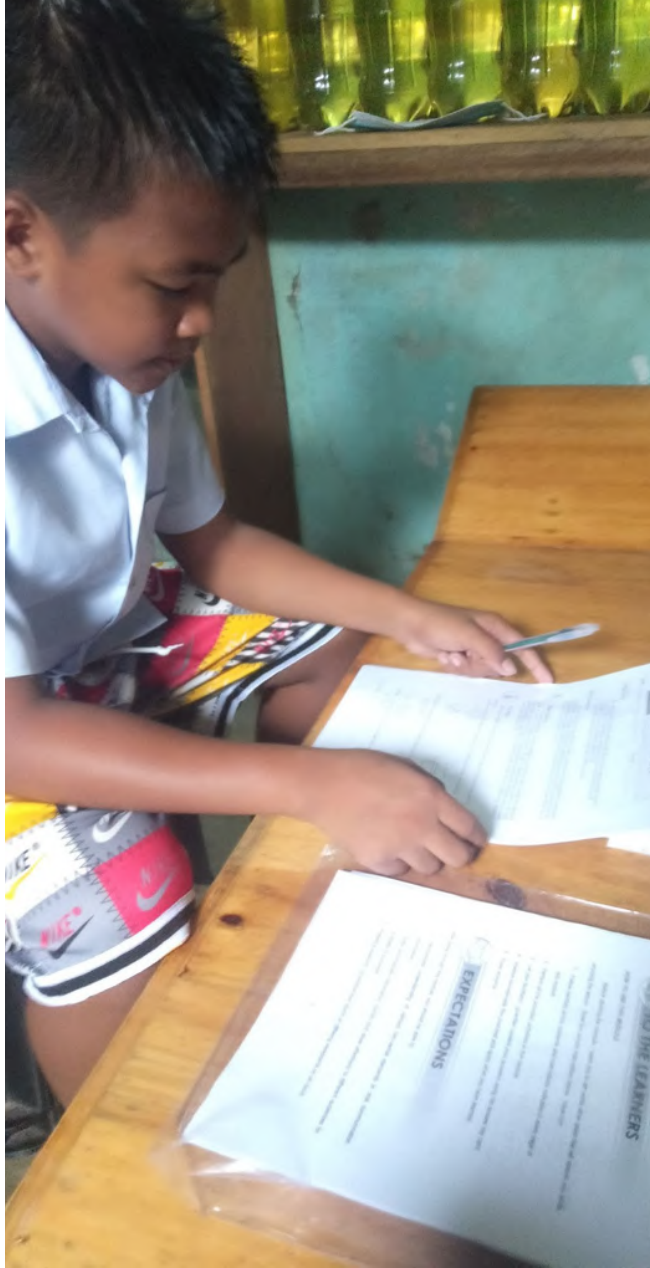
