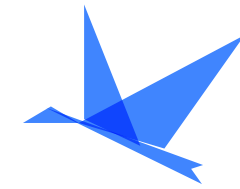

Currently, we have **8** sponsored Out of School Youth in Cavite and **1** in ASHTEC

All those in Cavite are now doing OJT and some of them are already able to help their families financially.

The one studying in ASHTEC has already shown transformation even if she has been there only for a short time.

We're praying that ASHTEC will consider adopting the concept of Cavite School, that of returning the financial support extended to every student so that the same amount will be given to other OSY.



# Feeding Program

Ministry Updates

As of 2014, KMI (in partnership with various churches, organization & local government) has **52 feeding centers** meeting every week. Each center **averages 30-50 children**. They are being taught Bible lessons (moral values formation) and are being fed with: 1) bread & pastries given by bakeshops, 2) cooked food sponsored by mission partners.

Titus and JR have visited the affected areas many times, and each time that Titus visits Tacloban and other affected areas, there seems to be little improvement

Assistance and donations in kind and cash were given to churches and some of their members, like: construction materials, mono block chairs, old clothes, groceries, food and many others.

A dome house was donated by a partner Korean Deacon to one member whose house was totally washed out. Latest news from her, they used their place for feeding and Bible Study and a church is already in their place.

Another 2 dome houses were donated by the same Korean Deacon to the church of Pastor Timkang to be used by visiting NGO members.

We have partnered with one Pastor in Iloilo who wanted to try raising chicken. The agreement is for the Pastor to return the money given to him as capital, then the same amount will be given to other Pastors to help them start a livelihood and earn a living. Not only him, but also the church's members and other members of the community where they stay.

In place where space is not a problem, this seems to be more practical and cheaper compared to giving the Churches financial assistance for feeding program. With the livelihood program, they can already sponsor their own feeding program.

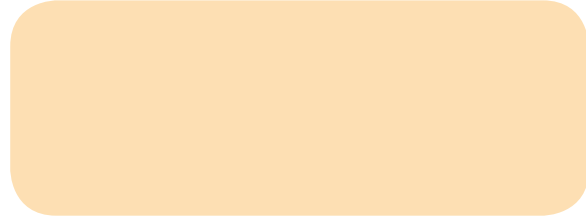

## Visit by International Partners

Our international partners were given an opportunity to be immersed in the ministry as they visited the different communities in the Philippines. They gave gifts, food, and medicine to the children in these communities, showing the love of God towards the children and their families.

### 01 Pstr. John Loh & Wife from Malaysia January 2014

Pastor John Loh and his wife Sis. Susan visited the city of Tacloban, Leyte in the aftermath of Typhoon Haiyan. Typhoon Haiyan hit the city last November 2013, causing great casualty and massive damage to the infrastructure and livelihood. Their visit was instrumental in the rehabilitation efforts as their presence was an encouragement to those they met in Tacloban City.

### 02 Mission Team from Kuala Lumpur Baptist Church (KLBC), Malaysia March 2014

11 Malaysians under the leadership of Pastor Timothy Yap from Kuala Lumpur Baptist Church visited the various ministry areas of KAPATID Ministry. They visited the Out-of-School Youth program in Cavite, the children under the Child Sponsorship Program, the Feeding Centers in Pampanga and Bulacan, and the prisoners in Iwahig, Palawan. They gave gifts and taught the children, their families about God's Word, encouraging them and strengthening their faith in the Lord.

They were able to give medical examinations to more than 450 children in Caloocan City, Quezon City, Bulacan, and the dumpsite in Pampanga. ## OFW Families

### Plan this Year

KMI ministry among OFW families left behind in the Philippines has become weak compared when we last started it in 2003. After evaluating the situation, we have decided to refocus our strategy.

1. To spend more time in Malaysia this year and minister to as many Filipinos as possible, especially those who do not belong to any Filipino Christian Church in Malaysia. Target places to minister are –
  - a. Genting Highland – about 500 Filipinos are working now at the casino, age ranging from 21 to 30 years old.
  - b. About 200 Filipinos working in IT Companies at PJ, who are regularly undergoing medical consultation/examination at Dr. Yoong’s Clinic.
  - c. About 200 Filipinos enrolled at the Philippine Embassy’s Resource Center in KL.
  - d. Other Filipinos working in food outlets in the Klang Valley area.
2. To endorse the ministered OFWs to any Filipino Christian Church near their place.
3. To encourage the OFWs to have their families (in Philippines) visited and ministered by KMI and its partner Churches in Metro Manila, Luzon, Visayas and Mindanao.





## Out of School Youth

### Plan this Year

This year, KMI will be looking for other training schools, to partner with, who are offering the same services and programs for out of school youth to increase the choices that will be offered to out of school youths.

In partnership with AMG Skilled Hands Technological College in Bulacan, we encouraged out of school youth to take short term training course for job placement overseas, sponsored by Engineering Equipment Inc (EEI).

Other out of school youth can also apply for a 2-month training at St. John Bosco Training Center in Cavite, who will then be recommended for OJT at any Electronic companies within EPZA in Cavite.

## Feeding Program

### Plan this Year

This year, KMI plans to expand its ministry in feeding the underprivileged children in needy areas and pursue its objective of transforming the community one family at a time by meeting the physical and spiritual needs of the less fortunate families. To make this into a reality, KMI plans to do the following:

1. To continuously improve its relationship/partnership with the donors and supporters.
2. To expand its feeding programs in areas where there are available resources from Starbucks, Le Coeur de France and Breadtalk.
3. To search for new partners who will provide for the needs of the program.

## Child Sponsorship Program

### Plan this Year

Currently KMI has 193 children who are under sponsorship. KMI is praying that more needy children will be sponsored this year and the years to come. With our goal of giving the children the chance to change the course of their lives through the Gospel and education, we continue to seek to do the following:

1. We are seeking to improve KMI's relationship with the Sponsors and be more sensitive to their needs as well.
2. Develop essential programs that will help nurture the child and his/her family wholistically:
  - a. Summer Skills Workshops for High School Students (Computer & Technical Skills, Communication Skills, etc.)

  - b. Family Activities for the Families. **October 2014.**

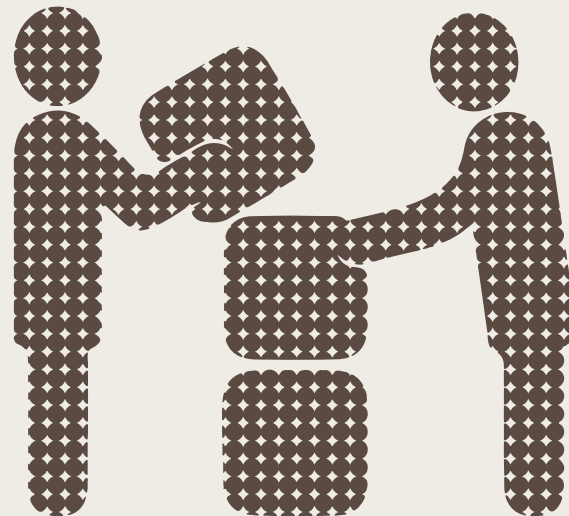
